5 Format

5.1 This is a one-division, no-boat-rotation regatta.

5.2 The Race Committee to run up to six races from 1015 to 1245

6 The Course

6.1 The standard course will be 4 or 5 legs (windward-leeward) with offsets and gates. 6.2 All marks will be small balls colored red, gold, or green.

8 The Start

8.1 Races will be started using Appendix Q, Sound Signal Starting System.8.2 The starting line will be between the RC flag and a mark at the port end.

9 The Finish

9.1 The finish line for leeward finishes will be the same as the start line.9.2 The finish line for windward finishes will be between the windward mark and the offset mark.

10 Protests

- 10.1 The four requirements for a valid protest are: hailing the protestee immediately, informing the RC upon finishing, informing the protestee ashore, and filing a protest with the RC ashore timely.
 10.2 Forms are in the office and must be filed within 30 minutes of arriving ashore for any break.
- 11 Safety
 - 11.1 Boston Harbor is busy with all kinds of commercial and recreational traffic. All large commercial vessels have right-or-way. Refer to the Rhodes-19 tip sheet for more info about traffic.
 - 11.2 Life jackets must be worn whenever afloat.
