Savin Hill YC/Boston College Sailing Facility & Logistical Information for Competitors

GENERAL

- Boston College Sailing is a member of Savin Hill YC all competitors are guests at the YC and shall comply with member requests
- The facility locks when you exit if going to parking lot, prop or hook door unhook/unprop upon re-entering.
- No gear bags, equipment, or food shall be stored on the lower levels of the YC at any time for any duration of time – please carry gear upstairs immediately upon arrival or leave in your vehicles
- Parents and/or spectators are welcome at the YC for the duration of the event and are welcome to enjoy the bar and the galley. Racing does not occur near land in the fall – binoculars are highly recommended.

PARKING/CHANGING/GEAR & FOOD STORAGE

- Ample parking in Savin Hill YC lot, do not block gates
- Arrive in full sailing base layers change outer layers upstairs outdoors or in upstairs shed
- Gear & food shall be stored upstairs outdoors or in vehicles do not leave or store any gear or food on lower levels
- Bathrooms are located on the lower level of the Club sailors are requested to dry off before entering lower level

BOATS/SAILING AREA

- Boats are stored on a floating dock and you must get a boat ride to them
- Upon arrival, dress for sailing immediately (review schedule in Sis) when you get a
 boat ride to your boat, you will rig and launch it without returning to land
- When there are multiple teams seeking rides to boats (a crowd), skipper OR crew should go one at a time in order to get the most teams to the dock in a single trip
- Tie sailbags to dock; Do not stand in boats on dock; Do not install rudders until boat is in the water
- Review sailing area map posted to Techscore stay in channel or in the mooring field (with boats on both sides) at half tide or lower.
- Yield to pleasure and commercial boats in channel
- Report any boat issues to RC and/or BC sailors
- During breaks in the racing, boats may be advised to tie up at the Savin Hill YC docks –
 be sure to tie to the leeward side of the docks with both sails down and stowed in boats
