## **SAILING INSTRUCTIONS**

## 1. RULES

The regatta will be governed by: the ICSA Procedural Rules 2017-2022 including the Collegiate Dinghy Class Rules; the 2017-2022 Racing Rules of Sailing; the Prescriptions of US SAILING; the PCCSC Standing Rules, the Notice of Race and these Sailing Instructions. In the event of a disagreement between the NOR and these SI's, the SI's will take precedence.

#### 2. NOTICES TO COMPETITORS

Notices, scores, and changes will be announced verbally at the rotation area or competitors meetings.

#### 3. SIGNALS MADE ASHORE

Signals made ashore will be displayed from a flagpole near the launch ramp and rotation area.

## 4. SCHEDULE OF EVENTS

## 5. RACING AREAS

The sailing area will be in Clipper Cove. Further description will be given at the competitors meeting.

## 6. COURSES

Courses will be chosen from the attached course chart, and will be hailed before the beginning of each start sequence.

## 7. MARKS

Varsity and JV share the same course.

## 8. START/FINISH

Start and finish lines will be between a buoy and an orange flag on the RC boat. Boats that cross this line when not starting or finishing shall be scored DNF without a hearing. The starting sequence shall be as described in Appendix S, with the warning given 3 minutes before the start.

#### 9. OCS

The RC may attempt to hail the sail number of a boat OCS, but failure to receive or hear this hail shall not be grounds for redress. It is each boat's responsibility to start correctly.

#### 10. CHANGE OF COURSE

The RC may move any mark of the course without signal before a boat has rounded the previous mark.

#### 11. TIME LIMITS

There will be no time limit. However, the RC may choose to finish boats 'on the course' if their position in the race has been established in order to expedite the next start or rotation.

## 12. PROTESTS/REDRESS

Varsity protests and requests for redress must be filed within 30 minutes of the race committee's return to the dock. Forms will be available at the TISC Office and Cal Team Table. JV protest shall be heard using the 3 minute justice system. Results of JV protests must be reported to the host school immediately. All boats must notify the RC of their intent to protest immediately following the finish of the race in which the incident occurred.

#### 13. SCORING

Scoring shall be completed as described in the Procedural Rules.

#### 14. RECORD OF PARTICIPATION

RP forms must be completed online at ts.collegesailing.org before 0800 on Monday October 9, 2023.


## **15. SUPPORT BOATS**


The host school will provide all on-water support. All coaching shall be done from the rotation area, or a similar onshore location.


## **16. DISCLAIMER OF LIABILITY**



## **Courses**









Course	Rounding Order
3	Start - 1 - 10 - 2s/2p - Finish
4	Start - 1 - 10 - 2s/2p - 1 - 10 - Finish (At start line)
5	Start - 1 - 10 - 2s/2p - 1 - 10 - 2s/2p - Finish

## Notes:

- -Marks 1/10 are the windward and offset mark, both to be rounded to port.
- -Marks 2s/2p are the gate, to be rounded from the inside.
- -Course 4 uses the start line for a downwind finish, whilst courses 3 and 5 use a separate upwind finish line, located above the windward mark.
