# SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

#### 1.RULES

The regatta will be governed by the Racing Rules of Sailing (RRS) 2021-2024, the prescriptions of US SAILING, the Procedural and Class Rules for Intercollegiate Sailing Competition (updated 10/17/20)(PCR) (except as any of these are modified by these sailing instructions), and by these Sailing Instructions (SI).

#### 2.NOTICES TO COMPETITORS

2.1. Notices will be posted electronically on the Tech Score notice board.

#### 3.CHANGES IN SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

3.1. Any changes in the sailing instructions will be announced orally and posted as soon as practicable.

#### 5.FORMAT

5.1. A and B divisions will sail together in provided FJ's.

#### 6.BOATS & EQUIPMENT

- 6.1. Collegiate Dinghy FJ's will be provided for competitors, who shall not modify any boat or cause them to be modified in any way. Competitors have the option of rigging the mainsheet purchase either 3:1 or 4:1.
- 6.2. The standing rigging shall not be adjusted.
- 6.3. Competitors shall report any damage or loss of equipment, however slight, to a member of the Race Committee on the water or immediately after arriving ashore.

# 7.ROTATION

7.1. The rotation of boats will be posted in Techscore.

# 8.THE COURSE

- 8.1. The courses will be announced orally and will be windward-leewards, with a windward offset mark and leeward gates.
- 8.2. All marks will be orange marks.

# 9.START/FINISH

- 9.1. Races will be started in accordance with PCR 18(b)(i).
- 9.2. The start line will be between a blue staff on the RC start boat and an orange mark.
- 9.3. The finish line will be between a blue staff on the RC Finish Boat and the starting mark for downwind finishes (W-4); or the nearest mark on upwind finishes (W3 & W5).
