- 2.1 Notices will be posted on the Official Regatta Notice Board found on Techscore.
- 2.2 CHANGES IN SAILING INSTRUCTIONS
- 2.2a Any changes in the sailing instructions before the event's start date will be posted to the Notice Board on Techscore.
- 2.2b Any additional changes thereafter will be communicated verbally at the competitor's meeting and/or through the Organizing Authority and the ICSA Rep.

FORMAT

- 4.1 A single round-robin will consist of a number of races equal to the number of competing teams.
- 4.2 There will be 3 races per set.
- 4.3 A and B divisions will sail combined.
- 4.4 A lunch break will occur roughly around noon or at a time convenient with any delays.

BOATS & EQUIPMENT

- 5.1 (18) FJ's will be provided for all competitors and shall not be modified.
- 5.2 The standing rigging shall not be adjusted.
- 5.3 The penalty for infringing instruction 6.1 or 6.2 will be disqualification from all races sailed in contravention of those instructions.
- 5.4 Competitors shall report all damage or loss of equipment, however slight, to the PRO, dock staff, Race Committee, or Finish Boat.

ROTATION

6.1 The rotation of boats will be in accordance with the rotation available online at scores.collegesailing.org

MARKS

- 7.1 All rounding marks will be orange/red balls.
- 7.2 The starting line will be between an orange/red ball and an orange flag displayed on the Race Committee start boat.
- 7.3 The finishing line will be between an orange/red ball and an orange flag displayed on the Race Committee start boat.
- 7.4 For upwind finishes on courses W3 and W5, the finishing line will be between the windward mark and a flag displayed on the Race Committee finish boat.

COURSE

- 8.1 Courses will be posted on the Official Regatta White Board.
- 8.2 Courses will be W3, W4, or W5

STARTING SYSTEM

9.1 Races will be started in accordance with PR 18(b)(i).

RECALLS

- 10.1 Individual recalls will be signaled in accordance with Procedural Rule 18(b)(ii).
- 10.2 A general recall will be used in accordance with PR 18(b)(iii).
- 10.3 After a general recall, the Round-an-End Rule, RRS 30.1, shall apply and no signal need be given.

PROTESTS

- 11.1Protests shall be filed in accordance with the ICSA Procedural Rules.
- 11.2 Protests shall be filed in accordance PR 30
- 11.3 Protests forms will be available on the Official Regatta White Board.

SAFETY

- 12.1 Competitors who require assistance from rescue boats should signify by waving their arms overhead.
- 12.2 A competitor who retires from a race shall notify the Race Committee as soon as possible.
- 12.3 Starts will not be delayed to accommodate capsized boats.
